INTRODUCTION

Worldview: The set of basic beliefs through which we see and understand reality.

All worldviews fall into 2 categories:

- 1. RELIGIOUS God exists
- 2. SECULAR God does not exist—or—we can't know one way or the other

These 2 categories lead to radically different conclusions about the nature of reality, the purpose of life, what it means to be human, how we determine good from evil, and the basis for hope and happiness.

Therefore it's important to answer the question: WHICH WORLDVIEW IS CORRECT?

This question is difficult to answer because both views lack undeniable proof.

For this class, we'll be reviewing and discussing a lecture by Dr Timothy Keller, from his Questioning Christianity series. Go deeper on this topic with his books, *Reason for God* and *Making Sense of God*.

To equip you to THINK and SPEAK clearly about faith and proof, so you can SHARE JESUS with others.
